### **Commitments & Expectations of Community & Membership Council**

#### Community Council

Participation in HYU Community Council is open to individuals, organizations & families who: support the temple's purpose, mission, beliefs & vision (attached); attend at least one of the temple's services & community council orientation

#### Membership Council

HYU Membership Council is open to those who attend community development sessions, study group for at least 12 weeks; Must support the temple's purpose, mission, beliefs & vision (attached); Attend orientation & training; Contribute at least 10 hours a month to projects, Attend at least one event or activity per month; Fill time logs and report assignments

The following are the basic responsibilities of the community membership council of HYU Community Outreach & Healing Initiatives:

Assist with communication & marketing through volunteering, internship, partnership and/or collaboration; assist with operations of HYU healing initiatives, programs, services, projects, events &/or activities; train/orient new members

HYU is an unincorporated, organized, self-supported, Universal Spiritual Temple. We are established for the restoration an ancient spiritual foundation of studying & knowing the self. #### **Statement of Beliefs**

11. Our restoration begins our return to the source (nature; a divine living energy)
12. Maat is divine natural and social order
